2. WHAT IS THE FILLING OF THE HOLY SPIRIT?

“And do not get drunk with wine, for that is debauchery, but be filled with the Spirit, addressing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody to the Lord with all your heart, giving thanks always and for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, submitting to one another out of reverence for Christ.”

Ephesians 5:18-21 ESV



1. The verb used for “filled” is plural, implying ALL ARE TO BE FILLED.
2. The verb used for “filled” is present tense (be filled), implying REPEATED ACTION.
3. The verb used for “filled” is passive, implying the filling is SOMETHING DONE TO YOU.
4. The verb for “filled” is imperative, implying A COMMAND.

Baptism of the Holy Spirit	Filling of the Holy Spirit
A positional* truth	An experiential* truth
Not commanded	Commanded
A one-time event	A continuous event
Puts believer in the position to receive power	Power itself
*Positional truth is who we are because of our faith in Christ. Experiential truth is how we are to live base on that position. One is a root, the other is a fruit.	

3. HOW CAN I BE FILLED WITH THE HOLY SPIRIT?

The filling of the Holy Spirit comes when we are cleansed from every known sin and every area of our life is surrendered to Jesus Christ.

1. RECOGNIZE YOUR THIRST for filling and desire it. (John 7:37)
2. REPENT OF YOUR sins and receive God’s cleansing. (1 John 1:9)
3. YIELD ALL OF YOURSELF to the Holy Spirit’s control. (Gal. 2:20; Mark 8:34-35)
4. TRUST GOD to fill you as he said he would.
