BUSINESS ETHICS – PART 2

I. The Foundation of Biblical Business Ethics

Key Scriptures: Proverbs 16:11; Colossians 3:23–24; Micah 6:8

Main Idea:

Business ethics begin with the understanding that **all work belongs to God** and should be done **unto the Lord**.

Truth to Remember:

God is as concerned with how we earn our money as He is with how we give it.

Key Principle:

Ethical business starts with a **heart of worship** — working for God, not just for gain.

II. Integrity in Transactions

Key Scriptures: Proverbs 20:10; Leviticus 19:35–36; 2 Corinthians 8:21

Main Idea:

Integrity means doing what is **right** even when no one is **watching**.

Truth to Remember:

“The Lord detests dishonest scales.” (Proverbs 20:23)

Examples of Modern “Dishonest Scales”:

- Misleading advertising
- Cutting corners
- Inflating prices or numbers
- Withholding information

Application Challenge:

Ask yourself: *Would I still make this deal if Jesus were my business partner?*

III. Fair Treatment and Justice

Key Scriptures: James 5:1–6; Deuteronomy 24:14–15; Ephesians 6:9

Main Idea:

God expects us to treat workers, customers, and partners with **fairness, justice, and respect**.

Truth to Remember:

“Do not withhold good from those to whom it is due.” — Proverbs 3:27

Practical Examples:

- Pay employees fairly and promptly
 - Treat customers with honesty and respect
 - Lead teams with compassion, not control
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IV. Stewardship and Accountability

Key Scriptures: Matthew 25:14–30; Luke 16:10–12; 1 Corinthians 4:2

Main Idea:

We are not owners — we are **stewards** of God’s resources.

Truth to Remember:

“It is required in stewards that one be found faithful.” — 1 Corinthians 4:2

Biblical Example:

The **Parable of the Talents** teaches that faithful stewardship multiplies blessings while negligence wastes opportunity.

V. The Temptation of Greed

Key Scriptures: 1 Timothy 6:9–10; Luke 12:15–21; Matthew 6:24

Main Idea:

The love of **money** is the root of all kinds of evil.

Truth to Remember:

“You cannot serve both God and money.” — Matthew 6:24

Character	Attitude Toward Wealth	Result
Rich Young Ruler (Matt. 19:16–22)	Couldn't part with his possessions	Walked away sorrowful
Zacchaeus (Luke 19:1–10)	Repented and became generous	Salvation came to his house
